


ON THE SCULPTURE FIELD



A meeting with Henry Moore

I met him at his home during the afternoon of July, 5, 1969, after two hours journey from London. The meeting was scheduled by the "British Council" which had sent him a catalogue of the "Sculpture Field".

We sat in a spacious room - filled with sculptures. Some were his, some African and others. Two glass walls revealed a moderately sloped lawn on which a number of his large, well spaced sculptures stood.

He flipped through the catalogue transmitting a sense of sympathy... "You know - - it's only recently that I started opening my statues to a movement of people".

We walked down the slope of the lawn to his work-shops where we found several of his assistants working on an enlargement - - in plaster - - of tiny models that he had designed - - for bronze-casting abroad.

When we parted he wished me every success. A month later I received the letter (enclosed).
